












NOTE

LEGEND

-  Lines of graves
-  Raised block edging (Hanson "Meadowstone" or similar) (with flat capstones to assist ash plaque installation if necessary)
-  Meadowstone edging blocks, flush with ground. No capstones.
-  Treated hardwood sleeper maintenance edge flush with ground
-  Future raised concrete edge (flat topped to allow installation of ash plaques to inside edge of cemetery)
-  Brown "Airport" pebbles
-  Bollards if necessary. At Lizard Garden these could be art bollards / totems.
-  Seats
-  Mulched garden beds
-  Existing trees
-  Proposed trees

Preferred treatment for southern and middle avenue sections. However, this would be more expensive than option shown of sleeper edge and extended gravel/roadbase surface. Latter option may encourage car parking between trees which could compact tree root zones. Both options require small swale at avenue edges.
